RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF DORCHESTER COUNTY, MARYLAND PURSUANT TO SECTION 9-505(a)(19) OF THE ENVIRONMENTAL ARTICLE OF THE ANNOTATED CODE OF MARYLAND ADOPTING A REVISION TO THE 10-YEAR SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT PLAN TO INCLUDE THE ACHIEVEMENT OF A 20% RECYCLING RATE BY JULY 1, 2014 AND PURSUANT TO SECTION 9-1703(b)(12) AND (13) OF THE ENVIRONMENTAL ARTICLE OF THE ANNOTATED CODE OF MARYLAND ADOPTING A REVISION TO THE 10-YEAR SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT PLAN TO ADDRESS THE COLLECTION AND RECYCLING OF RECYCLABLE MATERIALS FROM RESIDENTS OF APARTMENT BUILDING AND CONDOMINIUMS THAT CONTAIN 10 OR MORE DWELLING UNITS BY PROPERTY OWNERS OR MANAGERS OF APARTMENT BUILDINGS AND COUNCILS OF UNIT OWNERS OF CONDOMINIUMS AND TO REVISE THE COUNTY'S PLAN FOR PROPOSED FACILITIES TO PROVIDE FOR ADDITIONAL CAPACITY THROUGH VERTICAL EXPANSION OF THE EXISTING BEULAH MUNICIPAL LANDFILL FACILITY OVER EXISTING LINED CELLS

WHEREAS, Section 9-505(a)(19) of the Environmental Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland, through the 2012 Recycling Act mandates that a county authority shall include in its plan the achievement of a 20% recycling rate by July 1, 2014; and

WHEREAS, Section 9-1703(b) (12) and (13) of the Environmental Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland requires that a county authority shall develop an Apartment Building and Condominium Recycling Program (ABCR) to address the collection and recycling of recyclable materials from residents of apartment building and condominiums that contain 10 or more dwelling units by property owners or managers of apartment buildings and councils of unit owners of condominiums; and

WHEREAS, the County Council is responsible for the assessment of needs and constraints regarding solid waste within the County and identifying proposed facilities for the continued acceptance of solid waste, the County Council has determined that those needs would be best met, both environmentally and economically, through the vertical expansion of the existing Beulah Landfill lined cells.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the attached revision to the 10-Year Solid Waste Management Plan to include Dorchester County's achievement of a 20% recycling rate by July 1, 2014; an Apartment Building and Condominium Recycling Program; and to revise the County's plan for proposed facilities to provide for additional capacity through vertical expansion of the existing Beulah Municipal Landfill Facility over


existing lined cells is hereby adopted and approved by the County Council of Dorchester County this 7 day of October, 2014.
