RESOLUTION NO. 566

JUNK DEALER OR SCRAP METAL PROCESSOR RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Annotated Code of Maryland, Business Regulations Article, §17-1006, requires certain individuals doing business as a junk dealer or scrap metal processor in the State of Maryland be licensed to engage in said business; and

WHEREAS, the Annotated Code of Maryland, Business Regulations Article, §17-1003, requires that a county or municipal governing body in the county in which the license of the junk dealer or scrap metal processor is held shall be designated by resolution the primary law enforcement unit to receive records in accordance with the statute; and

WHEREAS, similar provisions in Title 12 of the Annotated Code of Maryland, Business Regulations Article, apply to dealers in second hand precious metal objects and pawnbrokers.

NOW, THEREFORE, by a unanimous vote this 7th day of April 2015, the Dorchester County Council does hereby enact the following Junk Dealer or Scrap Metal Processor Resolution duly as follows:

1. The Maryland State Police is hereby designated in the place and stead of the Dorchester County Sheriff's Office as the Primary Law Enforcement Unit for Dorchester County in regards to the enforcement of the regulations as set forth in Title 17, Subtitle 10 in Title 12 of the Annotated Code of Maryland, Business Regulations Article.
2. That the Maryland State Police shall receive records in accordance with Business Regulations Article, §12-304 and §17-1011(b) of the Annotated Code of Maryland.


